First and foremost, membership with the RNG Coalition is a commitment to support our mission and SMART Initiative, including through but not limited to annual member dues and in-kind resources.

MISSION STATEMENT

The Coalition for Renewable Natural Gas, Inc. (RNG Coalition) advocates and educates for the sustainable development, deployment and utilization of renewable natural gas, so that present and future generations will have access to domestic, renewable, clean fuel and energy.

SMART INITIATIVE

Sustainable Methane Abatement & Recycling Timeline (SMART) is an RNG Coalition initiative to capture and control the methane from 43,000+ aggregated organic waste sites by 2050, and achieve meaningful benchmarks by 2025, 2030 and 2040.

The first RNG project was developed in 1982 at the Fresh Kills Landfill on Staten Island, New York (still operating today). Over the next three decades, an average of just one RNG project per year was built (between 1982-2011). Taking advantage of the RNG Coalition's new policy advocacy platform, industry quadrupled that annual average, building four RNG projects per year over the next four years. In 2015, the RNG Coalition announced an objective to, through effective advocacy and education, enable the industry to double the number of RNG projects from 47 to 100 by 2025. Together, the RNG industry achieved that goal five and a half years ahead of schedule (July 2019). Thus, the introduction of our SMART Initiative during our RNG 2019 CONFERENCE (December, 2019). To scale and achieve SMART, we are targeting 500 RNG facilities by 2025; 1,000 RNG facilities by 2030; and 5,000+ RNG facilities by 2040. As of January 2023, we have 276+ operating RNG facilities with another 115+ facilities under construction and yet another 150+ facilities in pre-construction development.

ABOUT

RNG Coalition is the trade association, policy advocacy and public education voice for Renewable Natural Gas in North America. RNG Coalition was founded on July 7, 2011 as a 501 (c) 6 non-profit by Johannes Escudero (CEO) and David Cox (CFO). With the initial

support of eight (8) founding member companies, the RNG Coalition established a platform for policy advocacy, public education, and promotion of best practices for the Renewable Natural Gas industry in North America.

Advocacy and education influence public policy. Public policies impact markets. Markets drive demand (RNG, RH2, etc.). Demand determines value (value of RNG). Because the value of RNG impacts all industry stakeholders, we advocate and work to educate the general public, elected officials and regulators about the reliability, sustainability, the global and local environmental and economic benefits associated with sustainable development, deployment and utilization of RNG.

Our members represent more than 98% of the RNG produced in North America by volume. We are feedstock and technology neutral and support all sustainable end-use applications of RNG.

Through advocacy and education we seek recognition and inclusion of RNG as an essential element of any alternative or renewable energy, low-carbon or clean fuel standard or program.

We advocate for RNG procurement programs (regulated or voluntary) and favorable treatment of RNG as a viable investment and alternative energy resource in Federal, State and Provincial laws and regulations.

Our diverse and international membership is comprised of producers and consumers, consultants, small businesses, large corporations, municipalities and non-profits representative of each sector of the RNG industry, including: waste collection, waste management and recycling companies, renewable energy project developers, innovators, engineers, banks, financiers, investors, gas and power marketers, gas and power transporters, manufacturers, EPC, technology and service providers, environmental advocates, research organizations, colleges and universities, labor unions, law firms, power and transportation companies, fueling stations, airports, ports, cities, counties, municipalities, public and investor owned utilities.

STRATEGIC PLAN

PRIORITY: Implement and make progress towards achieving our Sustainable Methane Abatement and Recycling Timeline (SMART) Initiative

Further develop and implement an action plan to sustainably capture, convert and deploy the methane produced from every site where organic waste is aggregated in North America by 2050, meeting the interim targets identified and set for 2025, 2030 and 2040.

Supporting Objectives:

- Provide Leadership, Education and Advocacy for the RNG industry and general public that supports the sustainable development, deployment and utilization of Renewable Natural Gas, so that present and future generations have access to domestic, renewable, clean fuel and energy.
- Leverage industry expertise and increase individual member company engagement through active participation in focus areas contained within each of our five Leadership Advisory Boards (LABs) to support the RNG Coalition's mission and priorities.
- Advance Pro-RNG Policy (regulated and voluntary)- federal, state and provincial, legislation, regulation, and corporate ESG, etc. - that protects and expands existing markets and creates new market demand and demand diversity, with increased RNG demand for fuel, heat, power and products (marine, SAF, RNG-to-hydrogen, etc.).
- Expand RNG access to residential, commercial and industrial customers, without losing sight of the fundamentals and the principal markets that have brought us to this point.
- Bolster understanding of RNG's environmental benefits and build credibility with other stakeholders in the environmental community through improved consumer outreach.
- Enhance RNG's economic competitiveness by reducing the price disparity between RNG and natural gas, including but not limited to the costs associated with interconnecting RNG production facilities to pipeline systems.

FEDERAL ADVOCACY

PRIORITY: Restore Stability to the Renewable Fuel Standard (RFS)

Actively engage with EPA, Congress and the White House to ensure that the RFS RIN market is balanced through and beyond the 'Set' process, and supports stable and predictable Advanced and Cellulosic Biofuel growth.

Supporting Objectives:

- Nurture existing and foster new relationships with the Biden-Harris Administration, with Congress (US) and Parliament (Canada) to develop RNG Champions.
- Expand engagement with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC), with the US Department of Food & Agriculture (USDA) and Department of Energy (DOE).
- Support biofuel tax credits (Inflation Reduction Act, production, investment, etc.).
- Encourage EPA to expedite new RFS pathway applications, including for eRINS, while ensuring any new volumes are accounted for (and are additional) in each RVO.

STATE & PROVINCIAL ADVOCACY:

LEGISLATION

PRIORITY: Protect & Expand Existing Markets; Create New, Diverse Demand

Deploy resources to prime opportunities (i.e. development of a Low Carbon Fuel Standard in New York, etc.) and cultivate new and alternative markets (i.e. Renewable Gas Standards and RNG procurement programs).

Supporting Objectives:

- Support legislative direction to utilize RNG to help meet state climate change, pipeline and building decarbonization, energy and transportation objectives.
- Support legislative direction for studies of RNG feedstock availability, barriers to market actualization, incentives and policy recommendations to realize the full potential of RNG.
- Support legislation that authorizes, incentivizes or requires the procurement and/or utilization of gas from renewable sources.
- Support LCFS legislation that creates transportation fuel demand for renewable natural gas and renewable hydrogen.
- Support legislation that provides cost relief for pipeline interconnections.
- Support legislation that authorizes, incentivizes or requires RNG pilot projects.
- Support legislation that recognize RNG projects as being “carbon free” for the purposes of various climate change programs.
- Support legislation that creates funds to provide grants to facilitate sustainable RNG project development and RNG product deployment.
- Support legislation that creates tax exemptions or tax credits for investments in RNG production facilities.

STATE & PROVINCIAL ADVOCACY: REGULATION

PRIORITY: Obtain Authorization for Voluntary RNG Tariffs.

Address and overcome regulatory hurdles to enable widespread utility procurement, sale and delivery of RNG.

Supporting Objectives:

- Ensure favorable treatment of RNG in established LCFS and Clean Fuels programs.
- Advocate for the RNG's role in pipeline and building decarbonization, including in order to meet state regulated climate change goals and related electrification efforts.
- Support state and regional RNG and LCFS feasibility studies.
- Promote RNG in RPS and AEPS programs.
- Coordinate with stakeholders, and intervene in gas quality tariff proceedings when necessary, to ensure reasonable access rules and pipeline safety and integrity.

Today, the RNG Coalition has never been stronger, more diverse or better equipped - and the recent world-wide pandemic placed a spotlight on the ever-increasing importance of **access to and delivery of RNG as an essential service.**

We will continue to advocate, educate and build relationships - including but not limited to through federal and state **Political Action Committees** - with the Administration, key members of the US House and Senate, US OMB, EPA, USDA and DOE, and with State Legislators and Regulators. **Should legislative and regulatory threats or opportunities emerge, we are prepared to respond quickly and decisively, with unity and strength. We will measure our level of engagement by the potential impact on RNG and the RNG industry.** If a policy involves more than RNG, we will focus advocacy on the relevant components and comment on the entire policy only as it relates to the RNG Coalition's mission, SMART and any other key initiatives identified.

ADVOCACY & EDUCATION: EVENTS

RNG SUMMIT at the Marriott Marquis in Houston, TX (May 16-18, 2023).

Throughout the year, RNG Coalition staff educate key policy makers and regulatory agency personnel about RNG and legislation or regulation relevant to the RNG industry consistent with the RNG Coalition's mission and SMART Initiative. This event affords RNG Coalition members a midyear policy and related markets update, an opportunity for LABs to meet in-person, and for all members and attendees to network, including during hosted meals, receptions and activities.

RNG WORKS Technical Workshop & Trade Expo at the Music City Center in Nashville, TN (Sept. 12-14, 2023).

This event begins with a golf tournament at the Gaylord Springs followed by a two day technical workshop & trade expo (120,000+ square feet) for Biogas and RNG industry supply chain to educate, demonstrate and promote industry best practices, discuss technical aspects of project finance, development, engineering, construction, operations, maintenance, deployment and utilization, to showcase RNG technologies, capabilities, innovation and services.

RNG CONFERENCE at the Waldorf Astoria Monarch Beach Resort & Club in Dana Point, California (Dec. 11-14, 2023).

The RNG Coalition's annual end-of-year leadership gathering begins with a Golf Classic (on-site) and is followed by a three-day program tailored for RNG industry executives and principals to receive real-time updates on the State of the RNG industry and related strategy entering the New Year, including relevant RNG policy, politics and market developments. Registered attendees also take advantage of premier business networking opportunities that bring together decision-makers from around the world and support the RNG Coalition's mission and advance the RNG Coalition's Sustainable Methane Abatement & Recycling Timeline (SMART) Initiative.

ADVOCACY & EDUCATION: EVENTS

RNG CONNECT brings RNG Coalition members closer together, through a series of smaller gatherings based on shared member interests in specific regions. MEMBERSHIP LEVELS & ELIGIBILITY

Membership is on a per-company basis. Members may not reduce membership level based on fluctuation of annual revenues. In the event of a merger or acquisition members may consolidate dues payments but may not reduce member dues amounts. Annual membership renews automatically unless written notice requesting membership termination is provided in advance. The industry experience and expertise of our Members is extremely valuable. Members are encouraged to make their staff and resources available to contribute towards and serve the RNG Coalition's mission and SMART Initiative whenever possible.

LEADERSHIP: GROSS ANNUAL REVENUES: \$5,000,000+

ANNUAL DUES: \$30,000

Companies and organizations with gross annual revenues of \$5 million (US) or more and or with three operating RNG facilities are only eligible to join and maintain membership with the Coalition for Renewable Natural Gas at the Leadership Member Level.

Membership includes benefits for up to 15 company employees.

ADVANCED:

GROSS ANNUAL REVENUES: \$2,000,000 - \$4,999,999

ANNUAL DUES: \$20,000

Companies and organizations with gross annual revenues greater than \$2 million (US) but less than \$5 million are only eligible to join and maintain membership at the Advanced level. Membership will graduate to and must be maintained at Leadership level once gross annual revenues reach \$5 million or a second RNG facility is operating.

Membership includes benefits for up to 10 company employees.

GENERAL:

GROSS ANNUAL REVENUES: \$0 - \$1,999,999

ANNUAL DUES: \$10,000

Companies and organizations with gross annual revenues less than \$2 million (US) are eligible to join and maintain membership at the General level. Membership will graduate to and must be maintained at Advanced level once gross annual revenues reach \$2 million or a first RNG facility is operating.

Membership includes benefits for up to 5 company employees.

IMPORTANT MEMBERSHIP DISCLOSURES

Leadership and General level membership dues increased effective January 1, 2021 for the first time since the RNG Coalition was established in 2011, but are subject to change on an annual basis, including to support expanded national and regional policy advocacy and public education efforts and other member services on behalf of industry.

Membership is on a per company basis (each company in a portfolio must join separately to enjoy member benefits).

Advanced level membership is a new member tier added effective January 1, 2023 and does not apply toward RNG Coalition members approved for General level membership on or before December 31, 2022.

General level membership dues increased from \$6,000 to \$10,000 effective January 1, 2023 but does not apply to RNG Coalition members approved for General level membership on or before December 31, 2022.

Membership dues paid to the Coalition For Renewable Natural Gas are not deductible as charitable contributions for federal income tax purposes, but may be deductible as ordinary and necessary business expenses. The percentage of your annual membership dues that represents non-deductible lobbying expenses is 40% under Sec. 162(e) (2).

Membership is effective on the first of the month of the most recent past calendar year quarter (Jan 1, April 1, July 1, Oct 1) following receipt of dues, and is renewed annually thereafter on a 12-month basis unless otherwise noticed by the Member or RNG Coalition staff in writing.

Members are not eligible to reduce their membership level based on fluctuation of revenues from year-to-year.

THE COALITION FOR RENEWABLE NATURAL GAS will not use a member company or representative's name on a policy paper, policy letter, or in connection with a political contribution without express permission from your primary contact, or otherwise designated person. By agreeing to membership, the member company agrees that the company or entity name may be used by the RNG Coalition for marketing, web and social media, promotional materials, in connection with RNG Coalition recruitment and sponsored events, and generally on materials that do not take a policy position.
